This term in Science we are learning about these animal groups...

Birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles and mammals.

Can you find out about these different groups of animals and creatively show us what you have found out?



Can you go on a minibeast hunt? Can you record a tally to show how many of each minibeast you find? Which minibeasts are you more likely to come across in the Autumn/Winter time? Why?

Can you read some superhero stories? Which one is your favourite? Can you draw a picture from your favourite story and write a sentence about it too?



Can you create a game to practise using your compass directions? **North, East, South, West.** For example, could you be a superhero who needs to rescue your toy rabbit? You might need to go north 2 steps, east 3 steps, etc.

Can you create some 'camouflage art'? This is a very open-ended task so get as creative as possible!



Can you practise your cutting skills and prepare some healthy superhero snacks?



Can you make some signs for each of your snacks and write a label to say what super power it will give you? Let's get super imaginative!

Can you find out about toys that your parents/grandparents used to like playing with? Are there any similarities/differences to the toys



that you like to play with today?



Can you create a rhyming string? First pick one 'starter word' (they all have a 'split sound' in). Next think of four or more words that rhyme with your chosen 'starter word'. Can you write your words and draw your sound buttons too? Can you draw a picture to go with each of your words?

Starter words to choose from...

- *cake (split a_e)
- *bone (split o_e)
- *hide (split i_e)



Can you get creative and show us what a deciduous tree looks like in the Autumn time compared to the winter time? Perhaps you

could draw a line down the middle of your tree to create a really dramatic effect. Can you use different art materials to do this?



Can you design AND make a superhero mask?



Can you learn about the Christian Christmas Story? Can you get creative and make your own nativity scene? Can you name the key people?



Design, make and eat an 'animal food face'.



Can you design AND make a superhero cape?

You could use anything from an old t-shirt to a bin bag!



Can you pick any number between 8-20? Can you explore all the different numbers that you can add together to make your chosen number? Use objects at home to help you with your exploration (crayons, cars, fridge magnets etc).
