Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents/Carers.

What a fantastic week it has been. It is so good to have all of our Chantry children back in school again. The children have really enjoyed playing with their friends, seeing their teachers and support staff and being in the classroom again. We recognise that the transition back into school after a long period at home can be challenging and this week all

of our classes have been taking part in lots of activities to support children's mental and emotional health. Today is a Creative Friday which is a great way to end the week as I think that lots of the children are quite tired after their first full week back in school. I've included some photos of some of this week's activities.

I know that many of you are concerned about the learning that children may have missed over the two periods of lockdown. We will be working hard as a school over the next few weeks and months, supporting children to close any learning gaps they may have. This will mainly be through activities within the classroom but we also are running a range of supported groups and one-to-one tutoring across the school; where we feel children may need some additional support.

It will take time for children to settle

back into school, and catch up with their learning. During this time, we want their school experience to be as positive as possible. Therefore, we will be continuing to focus on a very broad curriculum with lots of practical and creative experiences as we have seen that this supports children to make progress. We have all missed out on so much over the last year and we strive to make school a safe, nurturing and exciting place for all the children at Chantry.

We will be holding parent consultations in May. This will give you an opportunity to see how your child has settled back into school and how they are progressing with their learning.



Drop off /Pick up times

Thank you for your cooperation this week, on the whole, our drop off and pick up arrangements are working well. Just a few reminders so that we can make it even better for everyone next week.

We ask all parents/carers to wear masks while on the school site. This is to ensure that we are doing everything possible to stop potential transmission of Covid and to make sure all of our school community feel safe.

During this week we have noticed that there are quite a few children arriving very early or being dropped off late. Please try and stick to the ten minute window for drop off for each class, if children are arriving outside of these times it makes it more difficult for us to keep the bubbles separate.

Please remember not to park or drop off children in Barrack Road outside the school or on the corner of Crowmere Avenue. Don't forget walking (scooting or cycling) is Chantry's preferred transport to school!
