Many children were struggling to make the transition to and from the playground in the afternoon and there was starting to be a lot of rough play outside which then had an effect on the learning back in the classroom. All KS1 and Reception children have an afternoon break either in the classroom or out in the playground, at the point in the afternoon when their class teacher feels they need it.
