Admissions Policy

Introduction

Chantry Community Primary School is a fully inclusive school and we welcome children from all backgrounds and abilities.

East Sussex County Council is the Local Authority responsible for admissions to Chantry Community Primary School.

Any requests for admission to Chantry need to be submitted via the East Sussex County Council website https://admissions.eastsussex.gov.uk/enrol/website/

Chantry Community Primary School regularly reviews in-year applications from this site and updates East Sussex on the number of children attending in each year group, liaising when there is a request for a new admission.

Admission to Reception is in the September of the academic year the children become five. All children have the option to begin school full-time if their parents feel they are ready for full-time education. If it is felt they are not ready for full-time attendance they may begin part-time but need to attend full-time at the beginning of the term of their fifth birthday. However, compulsory school age begins at the start of the term following a child's fifth birthday.

Parents may find it helpful to know that if there are insufficient places available to meet demand, these will be allocated to children in accordance with the following list of priorities:

- 1. Looked after children and previously looked after children.
- 2. Children who will have a brother or sister at the school (or a linked infant or junior school) at the time of admission.
- 3. Children wishing to transfer between a linked infant and junior school.
- 4. Children living within a predefined community area.
- 5. Children living outside the predefined community area.

If parents are unhappy about the Local Authority's decision there is an appeals process that can be followed.

Chantry Community Primary School follows the law on the restriction of class sizes for Foundation Stage and Key Stage One, this allows us a maximum of 30 children in each class. Chantry follows the guidelines from East Sussex of a maximum of 30 children per class in Key Stage Two.

Changing schools during the school year

It is sometimes necessary to change your child's school during the school year or during a key stage. In the case of a child leaving Chantry we welcome the opportunity to discuss this decision with parents before an application is made. In the case of a child wishing to join Chantry we welcome the opportunity to show parents and children around the school and discuss their reasons for changing schools. We will always ask parents to discuss the decision with the child's current school and it will be necessary to apply online for any available space.

East Sussex County Council follows a Fair Access Protocol to ensure that all children who may be vulnerable are offered a school place as quickly as possible. If you would like to make an appointment with the Headteacher or Deputy Headteacher to visit the school to be sure that it meets the needs of your child please do not hesitate to contact us direct. This is an ideal opportunity to ask any questions.
