Children will learn about the achievements of ancient Egypt. We will explore how and where the ancient Egyptians lived, what was important to their daily lives, and who was


We will also learn about how Egyptian people used hieroglyphs to communicate and compare the powers of different gods.

Sequence Sounds


This unit explores the concept of sequencing in programming, looking at sequencing sounds, events and actions in programs.

Science

Focus: Plants

Key Question: What do plants

need to grow?



Children will be able to:

- Identify and describe the functions of different parts of plants (roots, stem, leaves and flowers).
- Explore the requirements of plants for life and growth (air, light, nutrients from soil and room to grow).
- Discuss how different plants have differing needs to support healthy growth.
