The theme for Science Week was time and Year Six creatively explored different time related experiments mostly by flipping bottles. It was great to hear the discussions the children had before we conducted each experiment and then hearing and seeing how their ideas evolved throughout each day was amazing too! Others may have thought Arts Week was the highlight. Once more the theme was time and the children completed a range of tasks and activities before endeavouring to create their final pieces. As well as this, the children have continued to work hard in English, writing diaries, newspaper articles and non-chronological reports, all linked to Shackleton and his expedition. We did not finish this book and may return to it in term 6. Our maths focus has been fractions, decimals and percentages, perimeter, area and volume and statistics. All of these areas have looked at a wide variety of skills and reasoning style questions to embed knowledge and understanding which we are confident the children have shown and will be able to draw upon when required. Our preparations for SATs continue to be in full swing and the children are continuing to rise nicely to the challenge, developing skills, knowledge and learning habits which will support them with SATs and with their exams further down the road. Our English focus for this term is: Twisted Tales. This block of writing will allow us to take some well-known tales from our childhood's and twist or adapt them to cater for a more mature audience and to meet our writing expectations. For example, are the three little pigs really the victims? I am excited about the potentially writing pieces we can produce. In science we will be continuing to explore electricity and making our own circuits and we have a geography focus of fieldwork and skills once we have concluded our history topic of Civil Rights. We will be continuing with our preparations for SATs, making the most of our learning opportunities and having plenty of fun along the way!
