

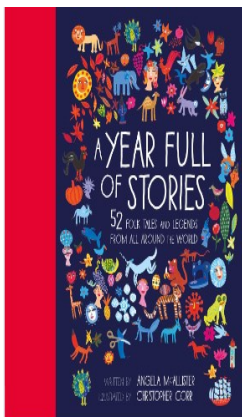
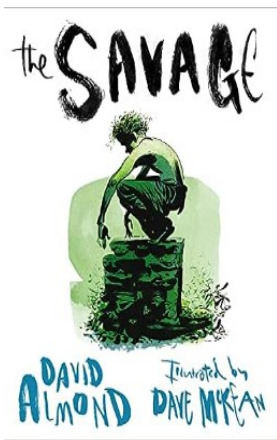
English

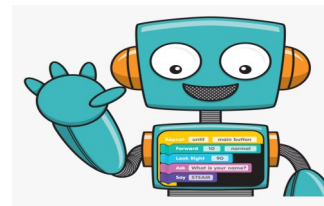


Objectives:
