This term our learning has embraced the cold weather and will be finding out about The Arctic, where it is, what it is like and how it compares to England! We will be reading 'The Lonely Beast' and 'The Snow Beast' by Chris Judge which will compliment our Geography learning based around the Arctic and cold climates brilliantly.

In Maths, we will be exploring the concept of composition of numbers, including tens and ones in two digit numbers to twenty.

In our writing, we will continue to strengthen our knowledge and independent use of digraphs and trigraphs (two or three letters that make one sound). We will also be focusing on ensuring that ascenders are long and tall compared to other lower case letters.
