
Year 3: Term 5



English

Power of Reading Text:

'The Tin Forest' by Helen Ward (Author), Wayne Anderson (Illustrator)



Writing: We will be exploring

themes and issues, making connections with our own lives and developing creative responses to the text through drama, storytelling and poetry. We will be writing in role to explore and develop empathy for characters.

Reading: We will be identifying how language, structure and presentation contribute to meaning and evaluating how authors use language, considering the impact on the reader. We will be participating in discussions, building on our own and others' ideas.

Class novel: 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes.



Humanities (Geography Focus)

Focus: Rainforests

Key Question: What is the biggest problem in the

rainforest?

Children will learn to:

- Locate the equator and rainforests on a world map
- Understand the different layers of the rainforest
- Investigate the threats to the rainforest
 (Deforestation and fragmentation, overexploitation, invasive species and climate change)

Religious Education

Focus: Christianity

Key Question: What kind of a world did Jesus want?



We will be identifying texts that come from a Gospel, which tell the story of the life and teaching of Jesus. We will be making links between the importance of love in the Bible stories studied and life in the world today.

Science

Focus: Light

Key Question: What is light and how does it help us?

Children will be able to:

- Recognise that they need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light
- Notice that light is reflected from surfaces
- Recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect their eyes
- Recognise that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by a solid object

Focus: Little Red Riding Hood

Key Question: Can I listen to the story of Little Red Riding Hood and retell the story using new vocabulary to describe different

body parts?



Music

Focus: Samba, carnival, fanfare, call-and-response, beat, percussion, word rhythms, music and community.



We will be exploring call-and-response through word rhythms, and body and vocal percussion. We will also be learning how carnival is a serious business in Brazil, celebrating freedom and bringing together, communities regardless of class or culture.

The children will be learning to:

- strike a bowled ball in an intended direction using a range of bats;
- stop a ball using a range of techniques
- develop fielding skills to prevent the opposing

Focus: Painting

Media: pencil, ink & paint

Skills: sketching, colour mixing, experimenting with composition

Key Question: How can we create a rainforest in the style of Henri Rousseau?

We will be sketching, composing and painting animals and plants found in the rainforest using techniques inspired by Rousseau and Gauguin.
